Recently some of our contractors were contacted by the RCMP to discuss “persons of interest” whom had worked in seismic this past winter. In some cases the individual asked too many questions about explosives and how they were bought and transferred. In another case the individual simply exhibited behaviours that were unusual.

If your employees report strange behaviours or out of the ordinary questions concerning explosives, please take such reports as serious and report them.
